Adaptive Beach Access

The Vermont Parks Forever Park Access Fund is getting people into the state parks, and the new Beach Access Initiative will get more people into the water! Adaptive Beach Access through the Park Access Fund is a new initiative from Vermont Parks Forever in early funding with plans to buy and install new beach access wheelchairs in Vermont's state parks. When a beach access wheelchair is available for visitors, the benefits are clear: more people are able to experience the mental and physical health improvements gained by spending time in nature. VERMONT FAMILY NETWORK

Vermont Family Network works to empower and support all Vermont children, youth, and families, especially those with disabilities or special health needs by providing parent training and tools to help parents become advocates for their children. With support from Vermont Parks Forever, 86 families visited Vermont State Parks, including: Silver Lake State Park, Sand Bar State Park, Mt. Philo State Park, and Elmore State Park. Families swam, hiked, picnicked, kayaked, and enjoyed playing in the sand - making memories and spending time together outdoors without financial strain.

RECOVERY VERMONT

Recovery Vermont provides Vermonters with services and support they need to achieve and maintain mental health and recovery from substance use disorders. Their network of 13 recovery centers received support from Vermont Parks Forever to create a campaign of awareness about the benefits of spending time in nature. Free entrance to Vermont's state parks supported people in recovery and their families.

NORTHEAST DISABLED ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

NDAA is a Vermont-based, non-profit charitable organization whose mission is to provide recreational and competitive athletic opportunities for people with physical disabilities, and to support disabled athletes in their pursuit of excellence. With support from Vermont Parks Forever in 2023, 138 adaptive athletes launched kayaks with an additional 139 family, friends, and caregivers. Kayakers enjoyed paddling at Sandbar State Park, Waterbury Center State Park, and Green River Reservoir State Park. Vermont Parks Forever and NDAA have been working together since 2019.

MENTOR VERMONT

MENTOR Vermont aims to close the mentoring gap and drive equity through quality mentoring relationships so every young person in Vermont has the supportive mentoring relationships they need to grow and thrive. With support from Vermont Parks Forever, 600 youth and volunteer mentors were granted free access to a Vermont state park. The Park Access Fund enabled many mentor pairs to visit a state park for the first time while building lasting memories together outdoors.

SPRINGFIELD AREA PARENT CHILD CENTER

SAPCC serves over 6,000 people every year in southern Windsor and northern Windham counties by building bridges of support for children, families, and caregivers through a broad range of wraparound services including childcare, community playgroups, mental health support, and financial assistance. With park entry covered by Vermont Parks Forever, 108 children primarily ages 0-6 and their families found peace in nature by visiting state parks including: Camp Plymouth State Park, Mount Ascutney State Park, and Lowell Lake State Park. Staff reported that providing free park entry strengthened their working relationships with community members.



"Knowing that I could go to Mount
Ascutney State Park for free was the
motivator for me to do something for
my family's mental health and wellness.
I loaded everyone in the car with some
snacks and water, and we drove up the
mountain, which was beautiful in and
of itself. Once we reached the top of
the mountain, we climbed the
watchtower! It is a reminder of how
blessed we are to live in such a
beautiful state where nature is always
at our fingertips to keep us grounded."



WIC (WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN)

The Vermont WIC program is a Supplemental Food and Nutrition Education Program for families that serves approximately 11,000 people throughout Vermont. In 2023, Vermont Parks Forever granted over 1,300 free days in the park to WIC participants and their families. Passes were distributed in WIC offices and through community events. The Middlebury WIC office reported the highest event participation in the office's history with over 100 people attending to claim park passes and receive information about WIC support. Many families reported visiting a Vermont state park for the first time, and WIC staff strengthened their relationships with clients and their community.
